# POND MAINTENANCE

There are always a lot of questions about the stormwater drainage system. The LVII pond maintenance contractor is sharing some information here for residents.

The main focus of Aquatic Environment Consultants, Inc. management program is to control noxious aquatic weeds and algae. The rooted aquatic weeds typically have one growth cycle per year which is different for each species of vegetation. There is also an optimal timeframe for which each species requires treatment. Common pondweeds are treated in the early summer, naiads are treated in the middle of the summer, and cattails are best treated in late summer. In some of the ponds, it is best to let cattails grow and not treat them. Cattails tie up the nutrients that make algae grow. In shallow ponds, it is better to have

cattails than to have a mud puddle that is filled with algae all the time.

Filamentous algae is a single-celled plant and grows whenever conditions are suitable. The species of filamentous algae will change throughout the season. Some species grow in the cold water of early spring while others grow rapidly in the heat of the summer. Algae growth is stimulated by phosphorus in the pond. The treatments that we are allowed to conduct will only kill the algae that is present at the time of the treatment. Since the algaecides quickly breakdown in the water, they will not control future growth. That is why we need to visit the ponds every two weeks during the growing season. You will see algae from time to time that grows between visits. This growth will be treated the next time we return.




